
You may note that some of the materials are Westing's.

Unfortunately, the treaty you have advocated for so long seems to have been forgotten. If so, I share your dismay at this turn of events.

You may also note some German material on the use of gas & etc. in warfare. As you will see from the enclosed correspondence with the military attache, this material includes the German field manual Myerwitz references which forbids the use of any and all gases in warfare. I have already shown this material to Prof. Baxter. I hope you find it useful. Unfortunately, my inquiries to the French military attache has not yet been answered, but if it is, I shall promptly forward that material to you as well.
