Dear Professor Meselson,

Thank you for your letter. We are so sorry that you will not be able to come to the November Conference, but perhaps you can send us some material for study ? particularly as we hope to keep the Working Groups and probably they will be the same as in the former programme. The one which is of particular relevance to you, is " The elimination of weapons of mass destruction ".

On the question of the letters from the U.N. Delegations, Mr Noel-Baker has the ~~exact~~+texts, with the exception of the letter from the New Zealand Delegation, which arrived well after all the others, and was delayed by our 7 weeks postal strike. He was most dissatisfied with these answers, which is why the item in last month's minutes (Sorry May 6th ...) mentioned that we carry the action no further.

In order to give our Members some idea of what was said, we made a precis of the letters, which I think I sent you, but which you may well not have received... posts being what they are these days. I enclose a further copy, and, as I have no access to photocopy apparatus, I am enclosing an exact copy of this letter from the New Zealand Delegation referred to in my last paragraph.
