Dear Matt,

The extract you sent me from the Congressional Record containing the text of the Fulbright letter to Nixon on the Geneva Protocol was very useful and arrived in very good time. I made good use of it in New York with the Secretary General and the Canadians; in London with the British, and Geneva with some others. If you would send me a copy of the Toronto Star article that you told me about, I could put that to good use too.

In London I was told that good headway is being made on the subject (c.s) and some people are quite hopeful that the Government may reverse its position. It would do no harm if you could push the Canadians a little faster.

I was very glad to learn that you are taking your family to the St. Tropez area (Ramatuelle?) for the month of August. It was most kind of you to suggest that I visit with you. I would dearly love to, but I fear that I won't be able to get away. Still, you never know, so if you can let me have your address and telephone number and your dates, I would be grateful.

As it so happens, very good friends of mine from New York - Bob and Irene Towbin - will be renting a house for the month of August in the village of Gassin, which is right next to Ramatuelle. Their address is c/o Coxon, Gassin, Var, Tel. No.: 97-~~74~~-74-23. He is an investment banker, but has very advanced political and social views and, for your private information, he has contributed to the campaigns of some of the more liberal democrats in the US. I think you and Sarah would like them.

I'll send you address to them when I get it
We are, as usual, moving rather slowly at the Disarmament Conference, but fortunately are moving in the right direction. At least the weather here is much pleasanter than in New York.
