Dear Matt:

I have your letter and the enclosures, all of which I have read with interest and care. Congratulations on your very clear memo.

Somehow I doubt that any interpretation of Senator Muskie's statement and the inclusion of the draft treaty in the Congressional Record is justified other than the obvious--the normal action under the circumstances by a subcommittee chairman. However, in view of the introduction of resolutions by Senators Humphrey and Brooke, it might be well for Senator Muskie to consider making a statement with respect to the resolutions or to the subject matter thereof. As you know, Muskie scarcely has time to give more than cursory attention to such matters just now. I think it would be best, therefore, for me to write him with respect to this in order that it may <sup>first</sup> receive the attention of his Arms Control Subcommittee staff. Perhaps I can then speak to him personally about it.
