I understand that the Ethiopians are stocking nerve gas which they have received from the Russians. I don't know directly the validity of this statement, although it comes on high non-U.S. government authority that this is so. Can you think of a strategy to interrupt the possible use of this gas by invoking the Hague Convention or the recent treaty which you did so much to bring about? Needless to say, this matter is of great concern to the Eritreans and other Africans as well.

Please let me know what you hear about this and what you think you might be able to do.
