

Dear Dr. Huselson,

I had to come back from Moscow earlier than planned, because I had troubles with anaphylactic shocks and the medical care is absolutely inappropriate, hospitals in Leningrad are bad, but Moscow is even worse, and the drugs from Switzerland were always stolen. But before I left, I was invited to a tv-discussion on disarmament problems, all other participants were from Warsaw Pact nations. It was hard for me; to a Russian audience I must have sound that strange as Russians do in Western tv. You may be surprised, but we even discussed Yellow Rain. I said nearly the same as I did in the Swiss broadcasting (the transcript I sent); but the Russian colleague said something about suppression, I tried my best, but as you know, I'm not good in diplomacy, so they cutted me off. I, of course, do apologize, for being that subjective in the Swiss broadcasting. But I can tell you, that the Basle Chemical industry reacted positively on my suggestions, Ciba-Geigy will propose a change of the OECD-guidelines; my other proposal was accepted, too, but that will take us longer.

I got a copy of the report of the meeting in Ghent provided for the German Defense Department. I won't be critical, but it seems to me, they did not understand you, too subtle. I'd like to read your lecture, if you have a manuscript and if you'll be that kind to send me a copy. In this context I'd like to ask you a favour, although I know, I've missed the simplest rules of politeness and I understand therefore.

if you will not do so, but I ask you: Will you please provide me with some photographs (yellow rain / mycotoxines) for use of a tv production?

If I'm not looking like a scabby dog - and feel so - in Oct. we could make an interview together, if you like. I was told that you've been invited to attend a meeting on chemical and biological weapons in Mainz, Oct 27/28. If you'll accept this invitation, please give a thought, if you'd like to meet some members of the German Parliament's Arms control and Disarmament subcommittee.

Finally I'd like to mention that Radio Swiss International got more than thousand requests of the transcript, I'd sent. I'm awfully sorry because of that personal remark on you. I asked for a cut, but the others involved argued that if we were not fully d'accord, it would strengthen your position. Please, accept my apologies.
