Dear Professor Meselson:


It was a great pleasure meeting you yesterday and discussing pressing issues of CBW and nuclear proliferation. I have to admit, I have not had such an invigorating arms control discussion since I left Argonne last summer. Somehow, non-proliferation is not a hot topic among all but a few Harvard law students.

I have to thank you for enlightening me as to CSIA's plans to expand its CBW Policy Studies program. The threat of proliferation is of intense interest to me and remains the focus of my research agenda. I will certainly pursue any potential fellowship or employment opportunities at CSIA, beginning with my meeting with Dr. Falkenrath next Tuesday. I am exploring an array of career options in the coming months, focusing mainly on fellowship opportunities and suitable federal government positions. Finding meaningful work in the areas where I can apply my knowledge of non-proliferation policy and international law is an obvious priority.

While I expect to be completely absorbed by my thesis this semester, I would be very interested in having the opportunity to work with you on a CBW project in the near future. Please advise me if you have any prospective projects where my experience might be of use, perhaps even with respect to the international criminalization issues you raised yesterday. Along those lines, Barry Kellman is presently drafting a chapter for the second edition of Cherif Bassiouni's treatise on International Criminal Law dealing with whether the use or possession of nuclear weapons is a crime under international law.
