As I have found my time with BCSIA to be useful and rewarding I should like to explore the possibility of extending my fellowship into the 2000-2001 academic year. The environment at the Kennedy School has allowed me to advance my research and writing on the UNSCOM experience and the Iraqi WMD programs. In addition to good progress on my larger work about the history of UNSCOM, I was able to write two smaller pieces: an article for *Politics and the Life Sciences* and a chapter in an edited volume on BW arms control. I am committed to a second book chapter for the VERTIC 2000 yearbook in the spring.

In addition to written efforts, I was able to present my work to two groups in the fall. In September I presented a report on UNSCOM to a Pugwash BW arms control conference in Geneva. More recently, in December I spoke at the Harvard Eliot House Senior Commons Room on events in Iraq. I am scheduled to speak to the Ashbrook Center for Public Affairs at Ashland University in April.

Beyond my own research I have enjoyed my work with the BCSIA / Harvard Sussex Program CBW Colloquia series. The series is an invaluable opportunity to hear (and meet) a wide range of CBW personalities. The Colloquia heard from three speakers in the fall; nine more are scheduled for the winter and spring.

I would like to continue this productive streak as long as possible! Please let me know how I should pursue an extension of my Fellowship.
