In relation to the B.W. Group I would be very grateful if you could get into contact with Dr. Bernard Lown, M.D., Department of Nutrition at Harvard University School of Health. He seems to be active in a group called "The physicians for social responsibility", which is a very worth while group and seems to be collecting both public and scientific journal data on the subject. The most recent article that he has sent me is one that I feel really needs answering and is by Dr. Clifford F. Rassweiler in the Saturday Evening Post of 30 January 1965 headed "What Is So Terrible About Germ Warfare?". One of the reasons that I would like you if possible to get in touch with him is that even if we don't want to get involved in public action in this field it would be worth while to have a group willing to do so. Secondly, the British Group of the Medical Association for the Prevention of War are holding a meeting in Cambridge this year exactly on this topic, and they have asked for a speaker to come from the States. Bernie Feld has mentioned Melvin Kalvin as a possibility for attending the Venice Conference if this subject is taken up, and I would like to know whether you think he would be a suitable person to be invited to this much smaller meeting in the U.K. in July.
