Dear Tom,

You may recall that when we had lunch in DC about a year ago I said I would give the Archive two CDs of searchable pdf files of all the USG telegrams (about 400) and a large number of other documents we have accumulated over the years relating to the Yellow Rain and to the Sverdlovsk anthrax outbreak. The Sverdlovsk documents include some key items in Russian, with translations done here at Harvard.

These CDs are now ready, along with an index to the Yellow Rain telegrams and I would like to deposit them with the Archive when I am in DC early next month.

I also promised to prepare an updated and corrected version of the posting for the Sverdlovsk anthrax outbreak. This I have at last done. It is in

MS Word Track Change format. It would be good if I could spend an hour or

so with you or one of your staff so as to explain what I have done.

course you may decide to use only a part (or none) of my suggested changes to the Archive's present posting.

I plan to come to DC Sunday evening, April 1 for a meeting at American University on biological threats on the 2nd, and could come by the Archive any time Tuesday April 3 or, if that is not convenient for you, Wednesday the 4th.
