Dear Matt,

Find your secretary. Your letter of the 19th was forwarded to me from Kullerberg's Trust. to where it was addressed. The enclosed report of the meeting with Trselius et al (dinner plus three hours at my home) was about to be sent off when your letter arrived.

I am glad you spoke to Alva Heyedal. Your talk fits in well with our discussion in Geneva. I shall be in London for a few days beginning 13 June and I shall take up with Robb the points you raise in your letter.

I am counting myself out with respect to attending the next meeting in Stockholm, but I shall do what I can to set it up along the lines you suggest. I leave Geneva on Sept. 2 for my quintical (back to the lab for a full year every five years) during which I shall have to return to Europe a few times for the WHO research program, and I can't take on additional trips. Also, my contribution to the Stockholm meeting from the technical point of view could be limited to a summary of the present level of lab diagnostic techniques for communicable disease, for which I could prepare a short paper if this would be useful, but I need not fill up space at the meeting itself.

Apparently, Poctor may possibly be enlisted in the good cause of declassification and cooperation with the rapid detection project, at least to a partial extent.

The WHO Assembly just finished and the World Health Research Centre proposal has been carried off for further study. While we received considerable

support from many countries, some
of the big boys here. I'm ready
to back it up yet, and we shall
have to proceed more gradually.
This is a great pity, but it
is unavoidable in the present cir-
cumstances (personality and politics
took over).
