Resolutions on ROTC programs adopted by the Faculty of Brown University:

18 March 1969. See Appendix of attached report of 20 May 1969.

10 April 1969.

1. It is the sense of the Faculty that, as of now, no incoming students shall be admitted to ROTC programs at Brown except under the conditions specified by the Faculty at its special meeting of March 18, 1969. The Faculty reiterates that the major aspects of the ROTC negotiations must receive its approval before any contractually binding commitments are made.

2. That an ad hoc committee consisting of three faculty members to be selected by the Committee on Committees, the President and Vice President of the Cammarian Club, and two members of the Corporation to be chosen by the Advisory and Executive Committee be established, to advise the President in his negotiations with the Department of Defense and to report to the Faculty at a special meeting on 18 April 1969.

18 April 1969.

All existing ROTC programs at Brown University shall be phased out unless they meet the provisions approved by the Faculty for ROTC programs. All efforts shall be made in this phase-out to fulfill as many of the Faculty provisions on ROTC as possible. The phase-out period shall be as short as possible.

The terms of this phase-out shall include:

1. Students now enrolled in a 4-year program shall be allowed to continue through and complete the program.
2. Students now enrolled in a 2-year program shall be allowed to continue through and complete their program.
3. Students who have not completed their final application procedures as of this date, 18 April 1969, in an ROTC program shall not be allowed to enroll in an ROTC program unless and until the ROTC program meets the faculty provisions as set down on 18 March and 10 April 1969.
4. If necessary, appropriate scholarship aid be granted those students presently enrolled in ROTC programs, if ROTC is discontinued at Brown, these students are unable to or do not wish to transfer to other institutions, and their academic records so warrant such aid.

That the Faculty accept in principle this report, and encourage the President and the Corporation to pursue further the overall directions indicated in this report, in consultation with similar academic institutions and with the continued advice of the Ad Hoc Committee on ROTC Negotiations.
