Dear Hedén,

Thanks for your letter of 9 July. We must keep in mind the time factor imposed on us if we are to do anything effective. I believe that the decision for the time of the next meeting should depend solely on the possibility of obtaining the attendance of appropriate unofficial officials and their technical advisers from the countries most directly involved in our suggested proposals, namely Sweden, Denmark, Czechoslovakia, perhaps Poland and Austria, with interested observers from the UK, USSR, USA and France. I don't consider comprehensive working documents to be a necessary preparation, and certainly our old group has outlived much of its usefulness from the standpoint of technical contributions.

I shall not be in Geneva in September, and I am afraid I shall not see you when you come through Geneva at that time.
