Lord Chalfont was out at the house last night, brought over by Weyland Young who was stopping by with his family en route for England. Chalfont did not know about the meeting last week although he was aware of the meeting in July being postponed. I told him about our talk with Alva Myrdal and he seemed completely informed about our BW meetings, to which he seemed sympathetic. I asked him about the possibility of involving Porton and he thought this would prove a bit difficult since Porton was under the Ministry of Defence. I told him we would keep him informed of course about any developments with our study group on BW, and that we should like a high official to attend the Stockholm meeting in an unofficial capacity. Incidentally, I spoke to him about these matters alone; Weyland Young was in another room.
