I am writing on behalf of the Pugwash Continuing Committee to invite you to a meeting of the Study Group on Biological Warfare which is to be held in Stockholm on the 22nd and 23rd October, 1965.

This will be a follow-up of the meeting of the Study Group in Trieste in April this year. As you will see from the enclosed agenda, the meeting will be concerned with two main subjects: (a) arrangements for pilot visits to laboratories in countries participating in the scheme; (b) the setting up of a collaborative research effort on rapid detection and identification methods.

About 20 persons from the following countries are being invited: Austria, Czechoslovakia, Denmark, France, Poland, Sweden, U.K., U. S. A. and U. S. S. R. Some of them will attend as observers.

We hope that the participants will be able to arrive on Thursday, 21st October. The meeting is scheduled to start on the morning of Friday, 22nd October, and to go on for two days. Should the need arise the meeting may continue on the morning of Sunday, 24th October.
