SUBJECT: 1984 CANADIAN CROSS-SECTIONAL CBW SURVEY IN THAILAND.

1. ON 13 APRIL 1984, THE PHYSICIAN AND CHEMICAL OFFICER ASSIGNED TO THIS POST'S CBW TEAM MET WITH DOCTORS DAVID J. ALLISON AND J.C. HOCKIN, FIELD EPIDEMIOLOGISTS FOR THE LABORATORY CENTRE FOR DISEASE CONTROL, HEALTH PROTECTION BRANCH, HEALTH AND WELFARE, CANADA. THE PURPOSE OF THE MEETING WAS TO OBTAIN INFORMATION ON CANADA'S CURRENT EFFORT TO DETERMINE BACKGROUND LEVELS OF TRICHOHECENES IN TARGET POPULATIONS WITHIN SOUTHEAST ASIA. DOCTORS ALLISON AND HOCKIN ARE COLLECTING BLOOD AND URINE SPECIMENS FOR SUBSEQUENT ANALYSIS BY THE CANADIAN AGRICULTURAL DEPARTMENT. DR. SCHIEFER'S LAB IS APPARENTLY NOT INVOLVED IN THE ANALYSIS.

2. AS OF 13 APRIL 1984, THE CANADIAN PHYSICIANS REPORTED THAT THEY HAD COLLECTED BLOOD AND URINE SAMPLES FROM THE FOLLOWING GROUPS:

6. BLOOD SAMPLES WERE DRAWN IN THE AMOUNT OF 10CC AND WERE PRESERVED WITH HEPARIN. URINE SAMPLES WERE PRESERVED WITH THYMOL. ALL SAMPLES ARE BEING COURIERED BACK TO CANADA.

7. THE CANADIANS ALSO OBTAINED SAMPLES AT MAE SOT ALONG THE THAI-CAMBODIAN BORDER, VICINITY (MU 5045) BUT OFFERED NO FURTHER INFORMATION ON THEM. BEFORE RETURNING TO CANADA, THE PHYSICIANS ARE SCHEDULED TO VISIT CHIANG KHAM, PHAYAO PROVINCE, THAILAND (PB 3557) AND A KHMER ROUGE CAMP LOCATED AT TA PHRIK, CAMBODIA (TV 2347).

8. COMMENT: OUR FOLLOW-UP MEETING WITH THE CANADIAN EPIDEMIOLOGISTS REVEALED THAT THEIR INITIAL DESIRES TO OBTAIN SYSTEMATIC BIOLOGIC CONTROLS IN VAN VINAI (AND PERHAPS OTHER AREAS) WAS LIMITED BY TIME RESTRAINTS AND SAMPLING SUPPLIES. APPARENTLY, AN ATTEMPT AT AN AGE COHORTING OF THE REFUGEE POPULATION AND STUDYING THE EFFECTS OF ALTITUDE OR DIET WAS NOT INCLUDED IN THEIR STUDY. THEIR STUDY APPEARS TO BE A CROSS-SECTIONAL, NON-SYSTEMATIC ATTEMPT TO OBTAIN BIOLOGIC SAMPLES FROM VARIOUS AREAS AND PEOPLES IN THAILAND. NUMEROUS ACCUMPTIONS ARE INHERENT IN THIS LESS-THAN-IDEAL SURVEY, HOWEVER, THE TEAM APPRECIATES THE DIFFICULTY IN ANY SUCH UNDERTAKING. ROY

3. THE CANADIANS REPORTED THAT NO SAMPLES HAD BEEN OBTAINED FROM THE BAN VINAI REFUGEE CAMP DUE TO THE CULTURAL ADVERSITY OF THE HONG POPULATION THERE TO GIVE BLOOD. THE PHYSICIANS ASSUME THAT SINCE BAN VINAI IS A CLOSED CAMP AND THAT THE HONG INHABITANTS EAT FOOD PROVIDED BY VOLUNTARY RELIEF ORGANIZATIONS, THE BAN VINAI POPULATION CAN BE REPRESENTED BY THE THAI POPULATION.

4. THE CANADIANS FURTHER REPORTED THAT THEY HEARD FOUR TO FIVE STORIES OF RECENT (WITHIN THE LAST THREE MONTHS) CHEMICAL ATTACKS.

5. SAMPLES ARE COLLECTED ON A STRICTLY VOLUNTARY BASIS AMONG THE HONG AND THERE WAS SOME INDICATION THAT PERSONS WERE OFFERING TO GIVE BLOOD IN ORDER TO OBTAIN OTHERWISE NEEDED MEDICAL ATTENTION. IN FACT, ONE HONG WOMAN WHO OFFERED TO GIVE BLOOD WAS NOT DRAWN DUE TO AN EXTREMELY LOW HEMOGLOBIN COUNT DETERMINED BY A GROSS CLINICAL EXAMINATION.
