
Thanks again for dropping by last Friday with the de-classified portion of your testimony before Fulbright's Committee. Jim Lowenstein tells me that the rest of the testimony will be de-classified and out by the end of next week. He's sending me a copy and I'll be most interested in it.

Lowenstein can't predict any certain dates for Open Hearings but he has confirmed that Fulbright is waiting for the ABM issue to subside and will then go to work on the Geneva Protocol Ratification. Ted Kennedy's office isn't making any predictions either, but I don't think there's much doubt that the Senator will be making some major statements on CBW once the ball gets rolling. All of this, of course, is of interest to us and any further clues that you might be able to pass along will be very helpful.

The Dyazanon information which you were kind enough to get for me has proved to be most persuasive in convincing my landlord to keep the stuff out of my apartment. Even the New York Times has gotten into the act with their editorial today on DDT. Ralph Nader should be happy about that.
