Dear Dr. Meselson,

I have finally managed to type up the references on the tear gas paper for you. They are enclosed herein. You suggested that I might try now to get the paper published. I would like to work over the manuscript once more to change minor matters of diction and syntax. Can you suggest to me which journals might be most likely to publish such a manuscript, and to whom I might submit it in order to tap the largest audience. You mentioned Saturday Review and Bull. of the Atomic Scientist; are there any others that I might consider? Is there any special procedure I should follow on making such a submission? Or can I generally follow my past experiences with scientific journals?
