He needs advice and since he will be in England soon, I have taken the liberty of giving him your name. If he should call on you, I hope you will be able to find a little time to help him.

I enclose a paper about the toxin question which may be of some interest to you. In places, it may give the impression that I am enthusiastic about nerve gas as a tactical weapon. Of course I am not. However, I have tried to show that toxins are in no important sense preferable to nerve agents and pose a major threat to us all. I would value your comments.
