- 1) I got him to go over the Thai-special-investigating-team bit again. The CIA--or at least Kit Green--did not know of its existence until August 1981, so he gathered from Kit G. And CIA first heard of it from Colonel Lane (the military attache at US Emb/Bangkok), who, during a session with Prince Chalemsuk, had been vastly surprised by the latter suddenly producing and reading to him 18 autopsy reports. Seagrave had the impression that that was the closest US Govt people have yet got to the Chalemsuk team's findings. He had heard from Kit G that the Thais have several rocketsfull of YR agent.
- 2) His statement to me earlier that the Thais had found trichothecenes before the US had was based solely on an inference he had drawn from what Kit G had been telling him .
- 3) Among the Thais recalled by Prince Chalemsuk for his team were some from Cambridge (Eng), including a graduate student who had been using GC/MS, described by Seagrave as a "physicist".
- 4) The author of that WSJ editorial series on YR was Carlsson--the person who did the (signed) WSJ review of Yellow Rain.
- 5) The person coordinating the State Dept end of things is Colonel Fred Celick (?spelling) of the State Dept intelligence bit, and is deeply into it all. On Rick Burt's staff in State/PMA the lead person is Blair Murray (Whom I met in Geneva in March 1980). She is currently in New York for the UNGA debate, staying at the Hotel Loewes-Summit (tel 572-7000) and working from the US mission (tel 826-5771)
- 6) Confirmed that it was Gene Henderson who got the YR bit into Haig's Berlin speech.
