Dear Prof Meselson,

We are naturally disappointed that you feel that you prefer not to join us at this time.

We do however, appreciate your offer to advise us, and hope that you will keep in close contact with us, and inform us of anything that you feel we can usefully do.

We were most impressed by your splendid letter in the (London) Times, and would like you to know that we have been actively opposing the British Government's backward step over CS gas, and that there is now an Action Committee on CS which WILPF is represented upon. This group has called for a Lobby of M.P.s on April 7th and though we fear it may not have massive support, it may persuade the Prime Minister that there are more than the 20 he alleged had written to him on the subject, who do actively oppose him in excluding CS from the gases covered by the Geneva Protocol.!

Thank you very much for the paper on toxins. May we use it? I think our international paper Pax et Libertas would find it most interesting. However, you may prefer that it be circulated privately?

Frank Barnaby suggested that you might know of another dedicated person suitable to serve on our Committee? we would be most grateful to you for any suggestions as we do want to get to work.
